Who we are:

The only residential summer camp in Canada serving children 7-17 who have a parent or sibling with a significant chronic illness or disability. Through no fault of anyone, these children have to take a back seat to the attention and care that's required by the ill or disabled family member. Camp Triumph provides a chance for these children to take a break from their role as caregivers and from the stress and uncertainty at home. They are able to have fun, meet others who can truly relate, and just be kids. They get so much out of their experience as campers which they take with them throughout the year. Our counsellors play a key role in enriching that experience.

What you would be doing:

Helping to lead activities and building relationships with the campers while looking after their needs as a part of the team of staff (counsellors, directors, program and activity coordinators). Experience with kids is an asset but not required.

Where:

Malpeque, PEI. Right by the ocean.

Time commitment:

You can volunteer for one to four of the week-long sessions.

Week 1: July 17-23; Week 2: July 24-30; Week 3: Aug. 7-13; Week 4: Aug. 14-20

What we do at camp:

Swimming, kayaking, archery, field games, sports (field and court), beach activities, arts & crafts, high & low rope challenge course elements, rock climbing wall, campfires, and more.

What volunteers get out of it:

The experience of a lifetime. You will find the campers will teach you perspective and the value of appreciating what you have in life. You will grow as a person and gain confidence. You will have just as much fun as the kids in a carefree, welcoming, and relaxing environment. Not to mention, it looks great on graduate school, health professional, teaching degree, and job applications!

Camp Nurse/First Aid Administrator (Core Staff)

Timeline:

Two - Four months (May - August) depending on availability.

Pay:

Competitive salary within the industry of summer camps. Room and board provided.

What you would be doing:

You would look after the first aid for the camp when bumps, bruises, upset stomachs occur. With just 70 campers per week, you definitely wouldn't be seeing patients constantly so in the meantime you would also fulfill the role of floating counsellor, i.e. helping with activities and camper supervision.

As a part of the core staff of Camp Triumph, you would be present for all camp sessions and help organize and deliver the camp program.

A full nursing degree is not required. If first aid is not up to date, the successful candidate would be sent to a paid first aid course prior to camp.

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Camp Counsellor (Core Staff)

Timeline:

Two - Four months (May - August) depending on availability.

Pay:

Competitive salary within the industry of summer camps. Room and board provided.

What you would be doing:

Helping to lead activities and building relationships with the campers while looking after their needs as a part of the core team of staff (directors, program and activity

coordinators). The core staff is present throughout camp, plans and organizes the camp program and facility before the camp session starts, and runs programming for renters. Experience at a summer camp is a strong asset but not required.

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Waterfront Coordinator (Core Staff)

Timeline:

Two - Four months (May - August) depending on availability.

Pay:

Competitive salary within the industry of summer camps. Room and board provided.

What you would be doing:

Running all activity at the waterfront (beach on the Atlantic Ocean). Kayaking, swimming, and beach activities are a huge part of our programming but require the right person to run them. The successful candidate would be very comfortable in a kayak and able to attend kayaking guide training prior to camp (if he or she are not already certified). You would look after the preparation for each session kayaking, lead facilitation of the kayaking program on the water, run beach activities if conditions are adverse, look after the care and storing of kayaks and equipment at day's end, and assist in other tasks/activities as assigned as a part of the core staff. You would also help with

supervision of daily beach time. Significant experience on the water is a strong asset.

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
